

FOURTH & FINAL ANNOUNCEMENT GLOBAL LEGAL AND SUSTAINABLE TIMBER FORUM (GLSTF) 2023

21–22 NOVEMBER 2023 GALAXY INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTER. MACAO SAR. CHINA

Background

The timber industry is facing major challenges. It must produce legal and sustainable timber products while also maintaining other important forest values. It must address issues in global timber supply chains arising from the COVID-19 pandemic. And it must bridge the widening gap between demand and supply as the world population grows and requirements escalate for construction timber and other wood products.

Given these and other challenges, it is essential to maintain and increase collaboration, and exchange views and information, among timber industry stakeholders worldwide—producers, buyers, processors and market players.

The International Tropical Timber Organization (ITTO) formulated its Legal and Sustainable Supply Chain (LSSC) Programme with the aim of building legal and sustainable tropical timber supply chains through a multipronged, integrated approach of governmental frameworks, private-sector initiatives, financial resources and capacity building. In collaboration with partners, ITTO convened the international forum, Together Towards Global Green Supply Chains, in October 2019 in Shanghai, China—the first global dialogue on improving the legality and sustainability of tropical timber supply chains. As part of the LSSC Programme and given strong interest among actors in the global timber industry ITTO and the Macao Trade and Investment Promotion Institute (IPIM) have entered into a collaborative framework agreement to co-host the Global Legal and Sustainable Timber Forum (GLSTF) to accelerate the development of legal and sustainable wood product supply chains.

Objectives

The aim of the **GLSTF** is to increase networking, collaboration and business exchange among timber industry stakeholders—producers, buyers, processors and market players—with a view to promoting sustainable forest management, creating legal and sustainable wood product supply chains, facilitating the legal and sustainable use and trade of wood products in a stable, transparent and predictable business environment, and contributing to sustainable development and climate-change mitigation.

Forum structure

The Forum will be held annually starting in 2023, and it will comprise two components:

- The Global Legal and Sustainable Timber Forum (GLSTF).
- Several specialized sub-forums (see below).

In 2023, the Forum will:

- Raise the profile of productive forests and their contributions to sustainable development and climate-change mitigation.
- Identify challenges and opportunities for the recovery of the global wood industry.
- Review the role of the wood products sector in global supply chains and its contributions to sustainable development and climate-change mitigation.







- Discuss issues relating to sustainable forest management and deforestation-free practices within the framework of the Collaborative Partnership on Forests (CPF) and the CPF initiative, Sustainable Wood for a Sustainable World.
- Promote the sustainable production and consumption of legal and sustainable wood and other forest products in international and domestic markets.
- Review advanced technologies and machinery for timber processing and production.
- Discuss green finance, blockchain-based technologies and other tools to improve legal and sustainable timber supply chains
- Make recommendations to promote partnerships for further building legal and sustainable timber supply chains.

Co-hosts & organizer

The GLSTF will be co-hosted by ITTO and IPIM and organized by the Secretariat of the Global Green Supply Chain Initiative (GGSC). The specialized sub-forums will be co-organized by partner agencies; ITTO, IPIM and the GGSC Secretariat may also organize such forums.

The **theme** of the GLSTF 2023 will be "connect, cooperate and share to promote the recovery of the global tropical timber market".

Specialized sub-forums will be organized by partner agencies to contribute to the theme of the main forum. These might be on selected topics related to timber legality and sustainability; sustainable timber resources, markets and trade; advanced technology and machinery for wood processing; green finance and innovative facilitating measures for green supply chains.

A **legal and sustainable timber industry display** will be organized in parallel with the GLSTF 2023, at a trial scale of around 30 booths.

Other events and activities

The Global Timber Index (GTI) annual report and the technical report of Blockchain-based Timber Tracking System (outputs of ITTO-IPIM collaborative activities implemented by GGSC), as well as other achievements will be released at the GLSTF 2023. Other business activities and side events, such as B2B matchings, can be arranged.

Date and venue

The GLSTF 2023 will be held on 21-22 November 2023 at the Galaxy International Convention Center in Macao SAR, China.

Participants

The GLSTF 2023 is expected to attract around 500 participants from wood enterprises and trading companies, industrial and business associations, governments, international organizations, research institutions, etc.

Sponsorship

Select speakers and panellists will be sponsored for their participation of the forum.

Languages

The GLSTF 2023 will feature simultaneous interpretation in Chinese (Mandarin), English, French, Spanish and Portuguese.

SEMINAR ON LEGAL AND SUSTAINABLE TIMBER FROM BRAZIL

Time Background Venue

15:00-16:30

The state of Mato Grosso, in the Amazon region, stands out in the international scenario as an important supplier of diversified and traceable forest products of legal origin. The state leads the Brazilian production of roundwood from legal sources, with an annual volume of 4.4 million cubic meters (m³), according to the Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics (IBGE). Local production through Sustainable Forest Management Plans (SFM) includes approximately 50 registered native timber species.

Mato Grosso state's sustainably managed forests total 4.7 million hectares. This entire forest area is protected from any kind of deforestation. This protection is guaranteed by the chain of custody for native timber species, a system used by the state's forest sector to control and certify the wood origin, from the forest to the end consumer, in line with the new traceability tools, which are the Forest Products Commercialization and Transportation System (SISFLORA 2.0) and the Forest Origin Document (DOF+Traceability), respectively state and federal system. The mandatory permits are tools for issuing, managing and monitoring the transport and storage of forest products of timber species native to Brazil and which enable the forest sector to achieve higher levels of environmental responsibility, an increasingly relevant aspect in the global scenario.

In order to continue and move forward ethically and transparently in forest business and to ensure the competitiveness and stability of companies of Mato Grosso, the Center for Timber Producing and Exporting Industries of the State of Mato Grosso (CIPEM) - an association that brings together eight forest-based unions in the state - is working with the state and federal governments to improve sustainable forest management in Mato Grosso so that the systems are continually strengthened and improved.

It also plays an important role in monitoring both the management processes and the forestry industries in Mato Grosso, strengthening the importance of following the new tools for traceability and quality in the chain of custody system for native timber species, promoting carbon sequestration.

This approach aims to ensure that Mato Grosso state continues to be recognized as a model in the production of traceable and sustainable native timber species in the world, emphasizing the importance of responsible management of natural resources and strict compliance with environmental laws. In this manner, Mato Grosso state accomplishes its role in conserving and preserving the forest and the environment for future generations.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

(A) Immigration Requirements

Participants are advised to contact the nearest Embassy or Consulate of China regarding immigration requirements. For your information, the Border Control Department of the Macao Public Security Police Force keeps a record of the entry and exit of non-local residents on computer, as well as on their passport, travel document or other appropriate document, indicating the limit of stay granted. If necessary, the Department will also collect bio data so as to confirm or verify identities. The Public Security Police Force is a department responsible for immigration control in the Macao Special Administrative Region.

(B) Entry Requirements

For entry to the Macao SAR, non-residents are required but not limited to meet the following requisites as well:

In possession of a passport, travel document or other document accepted for the purpose of immigration control, and the document should be valid for at least 90 days beyond the period of intended stay in the Macao SAR;

By means of a visa or other special advance procedures, or under the circumstances that such procedures are exempted, obtain the corresponding administrative authorization upon arrival at the Macao SAR;

Confirmed that there is no entry refusal reason as prescribed by law upon actual entry to the Macao Special Administrative Region.

Visitors are required to possess a valid onward or return ticket unless they can prove that they reside on the Mainland of China or in the Hong Kong SAR. The exemption is not applicable to Chinese passport or Hong Kong SAR passport holders who transit Macao to another country or region;

Proof of possessing at least MOP5000 as means of subsistence in Macao if the period of intended stay is 7 days, at least MOP10,000 if the period of intended stay is 8-14 days.

(C) "Visa" and "Entry Permit" Exemption

Nationals of the following countries and regions may enter the Macao Special Administrative Region with valid passports without visas or entry permits:

Asia: Brunei, India, Indonesia, Israel, Japan, Lebanon, Malaysia, Mongolia, Philippines, Republic of Armenia, Republic of Korea, Singapore, Thailand, Turkey, United Arab Emirates

Europe: Albania, Andorra, Austria, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Macedonia, Malta, Moldova, Monaco, Montenegro, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russia, San Marino, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom

The Americas: Brazil, Canada, Chile, Dominica, Grenada, Mexico, Republic of Argentina, Republic of Ecuador, Uruguay, U.S.A.

Africa: Cape Verde, Egypt, Kingdom of Morocco, Mali, Mauritius, Namibia, Seychelles, South Africa, Tanzania

Oceania: Australia, Kiribati, Samoa, New Zealand

(D) Visitors Who are not Exempted from a Visa and Entry Permit

Visitors who are not exempted from a visa and entry permit are required to:

Apply for an "Entry Permit" (aka "Visa-upon-arrival") at any of the border checkpoints of the Border Control Department of the Public Security Police upon arrival at Macao; or

Apply, by a representative, to the Residence and Stay Affairs Department in advance for "Authorization to Enter and Stay"; or

Apply for a 'visa' of the Macao Special Administrative Region in advance through a diplomatic mission of the People's Republic of China or a representative office accredited by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of China (visa sample) (Note: Starting from 1 July 2010, visitors from Bangladesh, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Vietnam are required to apply for a Macao visa in advance through a Chinese embassy or consulate).

Application for an "Entry Permit" (aka "Visa-upon-arrival")

Persons who intend to enter the Macao Special Administrative Region but have not applied in advance to any diplomatic mission of the People's Republic of China or representative office accredited by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of China for a 'visa', or to the Residence and Stay Affairs Department of the Macao Public Security Police Force for Prior Authorization to Enter can apply for Authorization to Enter and Stay (so-called 'visa-upon-arrival') at the Visa Room of the checkpoint upon arrival at Macao. They will also be granted Authorization to Stay for a maximum of 30 days once the application is approved.

O GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT MACAO

General

Macao consists of the Macao Peninsula and the islands of Taipa and Coloane. Three bridges connect the peninsula and Taipa, while reclamation brings the two islands together. The area of Macao continues to expand, now spanning over 30 square kilometers. Despite its small size, it accommodates almost 700,000 people, making it one of the densest cities in the world. 90 percent of Macao population is Chinese, and the rest are Portuguese and Filipino. The official languages are Chinese and Portuguese, but most people can communicate in Cantonese, Mandarin and English.

Climate

Macao's climate is temperate throughout the year. The average temperature is about 23°C. October and November are the ideal months to visit Macao, with mild temperatures and dry weather.

Time Zone

Macao is eight hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time.

Electricity

Electricity in Macao is at 230V, 50Hz. The power plugs used in Macao are of the three-pin, square-shaped or round-shaped type. It is suggested to check before using an electrical appliance.





Currency

The Pataca (MOP) is Macao's official currency. Roughly 8 Patacas is equivalent to 1 US Dollar.

Currency exchange in Macao is easy. The service is available at the airport, piers and most hotels. There are also plenty of banks and bureaux de change.
